### ROBERT HASEMEIER, BOROUGH COUNCIL, NEW CUMBERLAND



#### Career Highlights:

Robert Hasemeier is a professional engineer licensed in 16 states and has more than 48 years of industry, environmental and municipal engineering experience. He deals with facility operational and regulatory issues and permitting, and has managed or contributed to various infrastructure plans, designs, and engineering reports. He has successfully overseen the development of multiple environmental or municipal infrastructure projects.

He has provided testimony for a variety of hearings including third-party permit reviews, land development, and zoning approvals. Additionally, Mr. Hasemeier has been involved in local government and community affairs. He held the voter-elected position of Councilman for New Cumberland Borough from 2008 to 2015 and leadership positions for the Cumberland County Tax Collection Committee.

Robert’s career began as the Town engineer for the copper mining town of Bagdad, AZ. He also has experience as Griffiss AFB (Rome, NY) environmental coordinator, Oneida County deputy commissioner for solid waste management responsible for the development and operation of a 200-ton-per-day waste-to-energy facility & bypass landfill and nearly two years as an NYS DEC environmental regulator responsible for oversight of waste to energy facility permits and designs. His recent career has included work on a wide range of solid waste management facilities including landfills, landfill gas to energy facilities, transfer stations, construction and demolition debris processing facilities, and composting facilities. During the 1990s, he was a technical resource to several USEPA regions for federal facility environmental clean-up activities.

**Relevant Skills**

During Mr. Hasemeier’s career, he has been an active participant in demonstrating the following skills.

- **Economics:** Evaluation and comparison of multiple options and presentation of near-term and future impacts.
- **Planning:** Review of various alternatives and comparison to local needs and review of impacts to community
- **Analyses:** Reduction of various project options into ranked alternatives.
- **Design:** Reducing the data into functional and compliant facilities.
- **Permits:** Many projects have one or more government entities participating in the project approval outcome, usually via permits.
- **Public Participation:** Leader of meetings that present project findings or obtain citizen input regarding the alternative being evaluated and creating workable project solutions allowing projects to proceed.
- **Coordination and Liaison:** Represents the project and/or client to various parties and takes leadership roles as project spokesperson to achieve shared views and consensus.
- **Implementation:** A significant project conclusion is an ability to implement project goals. Provides QA/QC, evaluates alternatives, and identifies project components for scheduled implementation. Project implementation recommendations include management and institutional evaluations.
